God spoke to her to go to school and He has helped her every step of the way to maintain a 4.0 GPA.

Another great report that we have concerns one of our friends from the park named Phil.



Phil is a veteran who lives a homeless life. Sadly, this seems to be the case for many of our friends who

once served our country. Just after Christmas, we heard that Phil was sick and one Saturday while lunch was being served to our friends, Richard and Zoe went to where Phil was trying to rest in the park and layed hands on him and prayed for his healing. Phil was very touched by this act of love as they cared enough to seek him out and pray for him. Richard

and Zoe were used as extensions of God's love which opened up Phil's heart to God even more. When he went to the V.A. hospital he came close to dying as he suffered with pneumonia and developed a blood clot in his leg. With this close call to death, Phil said he recognized that if he died he would be okay because "he has made his peace with God."

Previously, Phil had faithfully come to our weekly outreach for months. At first he admitted it was just for the bologna sandwiches (which he still raves about) but as he heard Richard preach the Word, he hungered for God more than physical food. He listened intently and curiously asked several questions about God and the Bible. He was even reading the Bible throughout the week as he desired to hear more of the Truth.



God spared his life in the hospital and blessed him with some amazing

The V.A. not only helped him with his recovery in the hospital but they have also intervened in his situation and are going to provide him with housing so he will not have to live on the streets anymore.
