

Hello everyone.

We want to say a “big thank you” to all of you who continue to support us. You are



enabling us to continue to share and spread the Gospel to the hurting and lost. We have received another box of 28 Bibles which was sent anonymously. These came just in time too, because we were down to having only two Bibles left.

Thank you very much to the supporter who sent these Bibles.

Recently, there have been some problems in the park. City authorities detained the homeless which resulted in an arrest of one of our friends. Moreover, he also lost his dog, Jake during his arrest. Jake, his best friend was taken by animal control and caged for 19 days. Fortunately, an organization heard that Jake was in the pound, raised up enough money to get his



shots, pay the boarding fee and now we are happy to report that our friend and his dog have been reunited.

The reason for the recent authoritative invasion is due to the newly constructed San Bernardino Courthouse. The city had donated a seven acre lot to build a new courthouse to accommodate the needs that the previous courthouse was unable to meet. This costly construction is estimated as a \$338-million project (<http://www2.courtinfo.ca.gov/ccn/documents/102909-script.pdf>, 2009).

Unfortunately, this 11-story building is on the border of the park in which behind the courthouse, our friends have been living. The new San Bernardino



courthouse is expected to open in May therefore the city is trying to “clean up the park” by removing all of the homeless people from the park. This endeavor requires the homeless people the difficult task to gather all of their belongings, find another safe place to lay their heads and

hide all of their possessions so that they will not get stolen.



Needless to say, presently our friends need a lot of prayer in regards to their current living situation. One way we can help them is to provide work. It is coming near to that time of year where last year we provided work for our friends in the park.



They all worked hard and earned their own income for 2-3 weekends.

This year, we anticipate to be able to do

this again however, we need a van to enable us to transport ten people 50-60 miles to the destination of the workplace. We are trusting God for a rental, to borrow a van or a donation in order for the work to be provided for our friends. "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things

which God has prepared for those who love Him "(1 Cor. 2:9).

Thank you to all of those who supported us in our non-bake sale. Your donations have enabled us to personally design and order a couple of t-shirts for the ministry to provide better advertising with The King's Fishers Ministries. The shirts are currently in the process of being printed as you are reading this newsletter. We hope to have



t-shirts available for purchase soon to raise more money for the ministry and spread the ray of hope to all those who read the shirt.
